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

ORDERS OF DRESS 2137 CALGARY HIGHLANDERS CADET CORPS

GENERAL DRESS STANDARDS

- 1. **Hair** shall be neatly groomed and conservatively styled, and will not in any way interfere with the proper wear of a headdress.
 - a. Colouring of hair is permitted
 - b. Must be secured away from the face.
 - i. Any accessories used to secure the hair will be as unobtrusive as possible and will blend with the hair colour.
 - c. Long hair is permitted but must be secured accordingly when extending below the top / ridge of the shoulder in such a manner to prevent hair from covering the face
- 2. Jewellery. The wearing of jewellery is permitted in uniform however cadets must not:
 - a. wear jewellery over uniform items;
 - b. while in uniform, have ear piercings and ear gauges / spacers of more than 2.5 cm diameter or diagonal measurement (dependent on the activity whether for ceremonial or safety reasons, the number of earrings may be restricted);
 - c. wear jewellery in piercings which are normally covered by uniforms if they pose a risk of injury;
 - d. wear jewellery that impairs the cadets' safety or ability to perform their duties;
 - e. wear jewellery that a cadet knows, or ought reasonably to know, are connected with criminal activities that promote and / or express hatred, violence, discrimination, or harassment; or
 - f. wear jewellery that a cadet knows, or ought to know, promote and / or express: racism, sexism, misogyny, misandry, xenophobia, homophobia, ableism, or sexually explicit material.
- 3. Cadets shall not display tattoos that are deemed to be offensive (e.g. pornographic, blasphemous, racist, homophobic, antisemitic, Islamophobic, etc.) or otherwise reflect discredit on the Canadian Cadet Organization (CCO).
 - a. If a cadet is found to have such a tattoo, they must cover the tattoo at all times during cadet training, whether in uniform or in civilian clothing.





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Male Cadets




Figure 1 -Hair – Male Cadets

- 1. Facial hair must be kept short and clean while in uniform, although a cadet may grow facial hair at any point, no permission is needed. Refer to Figure 1.




Figure 2 - Facial Hair – Male Cadets

- 2. Hair must not go past the collar and shall not obstruct the wearing of a headdress or impact safety. Refer to Figure 2.
 - a. Exceptions may apply to those whose culture or religion goes against those requirements

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Female Cadets

- 1. Female cadets with long hair must wear their hair up in either braids or a bun.
 - a. Ponytails are permitted, **except** when in the C1 uniform.




Figure 3 - Hair – Female Cadets





Figure 4 – Hair – Female Cadets (Braids and Cornrow Braids)

 - b. Hair will be secured in order to present a clean and professional appearance. Refer to **Figure 3, 4 and 5**.

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






Figure 4 – Hair – Female Cadets (pony-tail and multi-braid pony-tail)

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Uniform Standards (C1-COs dress, C3A/H-Walking out dress)

- 1. **Pants** will be ironed, clean and free of wrinkles.
 - a. The pants will be creased along the front and back of the pant leg. The creases will extend from the first belt loop of the pant, down the centre of the leg to the very bottom.
 - b. The pants will be properly fitted and belted in order for the creases to extend in one straight clean line.
- 2. The issued **tunic** will be clean and pressed with no creases shown anywhere on the tunic;
 - a. The pockets will be pressed flat, along with the collar.
 - b. The nametag of the cadet will be positioned in line with the top of the right pocket, centered with the middle of the name and the button.
 - i. The standard CAF name tag shall be detachable, made of black and white laminated plastic plate 6.3 cm in length and 1.2 cm in height, inscribed in capital letters with white lettering 0.6 cm high, and shall indicate the surname of the cadet only.¹
 - c. The **tunic belt buckle** will be centered, with the excess belt tucked under the provided belt loops;
 - i. The buckle shall be adjusted so that the excess of the belt is not more than 8 cm.
 - ii. The loose end of the belt will extend to the left of the wearer when properly
 - iii. No slack should be visible in the belt.

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


Figure 6- Left Sleeve Insignia Placement

 - d. **Badges** will be sewn on as per Cadet Standards and Corps standards. Refer to **Figures 6, and 7**
 - i. If a Cadet has any older, bigger Cadet Summer Training Centre (CSTC) badges, they will be sewn on their own row above the newer, smaller CSTC badges in the same precedence of order.
- 3. The CAF **green shirt** will be clean and free of wrinkles;
 - a. Creases shall extend from the centerline of the epaulette on each sleeve down through the cuff.
 - b. The appropriate rank slip-on will be placed on the epaulette at all times.
 - c. The CAF green shirt will be tucked into the pants at all times.
- 4. The issued **brass belt** will have the brass on the end of the belt and the fastener itself touching when worn;
 - a. No black belt webbing is to be seen between the end of the belt and the front of the buckle.(brass on brass)
 - b. It will be used to hold up the dress pants at all times.
 - c. The belt buckle should be polished and always buffed.

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


Figure 7- Right Sleeve Insignia Placement



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- 5. The **necktie** is to be ironed flat;




Figure 8- Necktie Windsor Knot

 - a. The tie will be fixed with a **double Windsor knot** as shown in **Figure 8**.¹
 - b. The necktie will be centered and will cover the topmost button of the CF green shirt.
 - c. It will be untied and re-tied every time it is used.

- 6. **Parade boots** (aka Boots Ankle/Shoes) will have the entire boot including the toe, heel, and sides polished to a reflective shine, along with blackened soles.
 - a. Parade boots will be straight laced, with the top two eyelets being **captain barred**.¹
 - b. The remaining laces will be tucked into the boot securely, to ensure that the laces never show.
 - c. Boots will not be modified with any type of metal cleats, hobnails or other metal attachments to heel or sole.¹
 - d. Refer to Figure 9 for straight across lacing of Parade Boots.

- 7. **Headdress** will be formed with a trench and will have no lint on it;
 - a. The cap brass will be positioned **over the left eye**.




Figure 10 - Headdress - Beret

 - b. The beret itself will sit level across the entire head, parallel to the ground with approximately a two-finger space between the beginning of the beret and the brow bone. Refer to **Figure 10**.

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




Figure 11 – How to Form and Wear the Beret Correctly -Other forms of authorized Cadet headdress.

8. The **beret** will be formed with a **trench** and will have no lint on it. Breaking in a new beret takes time. After you have adjusted the tightening band to a comfortable fit and tied it off, dampen (not soak) the beret and place it properly on your head. Wear until dry. Berets are pure wool and will shrink considerably. Repeat if needed to get that perfect form fit. Keep it on until it is dry or it may shrink too much to fit. When you have it just right, finish by tucking the "tail" into the adjustment band. Refer to **Figure 11**.

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
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Uniform Standards (C5-FTUs)

- 1. The entire **uniform** must be **clean** and free of stains.
 - a. All pockets and the collar will be ironed and flattened.
 - b. There will be no creases or wrinkles in the uniform.
 - c. Dust cuffs (fabric liner on the inside of the cuff) will be unbuttoned and tucked into the boot prior to lacing and blousing.
 - d. The pants will be bloused properly or at least tucked in along the top of the FTU/Combat boot.

Multi-purpose boots (**FTU or field boots**) will be blackened to a matte so that there is no shine whatsoever.

- a. Will be laced in the herring bone method as shown in **Figure 12**.¹
- a. Extra laces will be tucked into the boot so that none are shown.

Tam O'Shanter (Tam) will be clean and free of wrinkles.

- a. It will be ironed flat on the front and along the crease all around the headdress.
 - i. When properly ironed, the Tam will lay flat, parallel with the forehead.
 - ii. It will not be secured with pins or in any other fashion.
- b. When worn, the cap badge will be placed over the left ear. Refer to Figure 13

c. For 2137 Corps (FTXs), **FTUs are the only permitted field dress for 2137 Cadets, arriving, and departing from training**. Cadets without FTUs are to arrive in suitable civilian clothing. Civilian camouflage-pattern clothing or field uniforms from other countries, are **not to be mixed with FTU clothing**, and should **only be used as spare clothing once in the field**. Old olive drab dress can be worn in the field because it looks like our FTUs and has been issued to our Corps in the past. It is to be phased out as quickly as possible. **CADPAT is NOT authorized field dress** for 2137 Cadets participating in field exercises and training and can only be worn legally by members of the Canadian Armed Forces.



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2137 CALGARY HIGHLANDER ARMY CADET (RCAC) <u>UNIFORM</u>

(NUMBERED DRESS FORMS)

Undergarments shall be worn under all orders of dress and shall be of an appropriate color so as. Not to be visible through uniform and civilian items of clothing.

Ceremonial Dress or **Parade Dress** or **C1/C1H** will be worn for formal ceremonies such as the Commanding Officer's (COs) Parade.

C1(COs dress)

- a. Headdress, Canadian Armed Forces (CAF) green shirt, tie, cadet jacket/tunic, pants with belt and parade boots will be worn with the C1 order of dress.
- b. Refer to Figure 14.

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<u>C1H</u> Ceremonial Dress (COs dress with kilts) will be worn for formal ceremonies such as the Commanding Officer's (COs) Parade.

- a. A Glengarry with a cap brass, CAF green shirt, tie, cadet jacket/tunic (cutaway or fold away), black webbelt with brass buckle, kilt, leather/horse-hair sporran, diced top hose, spats, red flashes and Oxford shoes will be worn with the C1H dress.
- b. The White webbelt shall only be worn if you possess a parade position
- c. If you do not have a parade position, you are NOT to wear your black kilt belt. Wear the tunic belt instead.
- d. Refer to Figure 15

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Routine Training Dress or <u>C3/C3A(Walking out)/C3H</u> will be worn as normal dress for all seasons.

C3A(Walking out)

- a. Headdress, CAF green shirt, cadet jacket/tunic, pants with belt and parade boots will be worn with the C3A order of dress.
 - i. The C3A order of dress will be worn WITHOUT the tie
 - ii. Only undressed ribbons will be worn with the C3A order of dress.
- b. C3A will be worn **with or without** the cadet jacket/tunic, depending on the season.
- c. Refer to **Figure 17** for C3A(Walking out)

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C3H(Walking out with kilts)

- a. A Glengarry with a cap brass, CAF green shirt, tie, cadet jacket/tunic (cutaway or fold away), black/white webbelt with brass buckle, kilt, leather sporran, lovat hose, red flashes, and Oxford shoes will be worn with the duty dress dress.
 - i. Undressed ribbons will be worn with the C3 order of dress.
- b. **C3H** will be worn **with/without** the cadet jacket/tunic and tie depending on the season
- c. The only pins that will be worn on the C3H order of dress will be the; name tag, undressed ribbons, expedition pins and cadet citation pins. Biathlon/Marksmanship pins and Duke of Edinburgh pins **are not** to be worn on the dress shirt but are to be worn on the tunic.
- d. Metal Parachutist Wings may be worn on the C3H order of dress in the cadet has earned them.
- e. Refer to Figure 18

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<u>C3</u>

- a. Headdress, CAF green shirt, tie, cadet jacket/tunic, pants with belt and parade boots will be worn with the C3 order of dress.
 - iii. The C3 order of dress will be worn WITH the tie
 - iv. Only undressed ribbons will be worn with the C3 order of dress.
- b. C3 will be worn with or without the cadet jacket/tunic, depending on the season.
- c. Refer to **Figure 16** for C3

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<u>C2(Mess Dress)</u> Ceremonial Dress will be worn at formal events such as mess dinners.

- a. The same as C1 with the exception of a white dress shirt, black bow tie and leather sporran only.
- b. If cadet does not have a white dress shirt and/or black bow tie, they may wear C1H without the headdress, nametag and medals(ribbons are worn in replacement).

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ROYAL CANADIAN ARMY CADET (RCAC) FIELD TRAINING UNIFORM (FTU) OR FTU C5

The **FTU/C5** will be worn on specified training nights. Cadets will **arrive and leave** in their FTU for Field Training Exercises (FTX).

- a. Headdress, olive drab T-shirt, FTU tunic, FTU pants with belt and Wet Weather Boots will be worn with the FTU
- b. Refer to **Figure 20**

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FITNESS TESTING/SPORTS NIGHT DRESS

- 1. For fitness testing/sports nights **shorts/pants**.
 - a. Will be worn and when otherwise authorized.
 - b. Shall be worn at the waist and must not allow underwear to be visible.¹
 - c. Will not be shorter than the middle of the knee.
 - d. No tights or spandex type pants/slacks.
 - e. If the cadet does not have appropriate sports shorts/pants, they may wear their FTU pants.
- 2. For fitness testing/sports nights (Green Elemental/Calgary Highlanders blue T-shirt)
 - a. Must be tucked into shorts/pants.¹
 - b. Tank tops are not permitted for any gender.
 - c. If issued, The Calgary Highlanders blue T-shirt is to be worn in lieu of other sports tops.
 - d. Appropriate civilian sports attire may be worn however must not have any inappropriate symbols/language.
- 3. **Running shoes** will be worn for fitness testing/sports nights.

Uniform Standards

- 1. **Glengarries** will only be worn by Cadets who have passed their **completed** all the requirements to obtain a Glengarry.
 - a. When issued a **Glengarry**, the Cadet will also draw a **Tam O'Shanter (Tam)** to wear with the FTU and will **cease to wear a beret**.
 - b. The Glengarry is only to be worn in C1 and C3A, and will NOT be worn with FTUs, if the Cadet does not have a Tam, they shall continue to wear their beret.
 - i. The Glengarry and Tam O'Shanter headdresses shall carry the cap brass of the Calgary Highlanders Infantry Regiment in gold so as to differentiate Cadets from the serving members of the Regiment itself.
 - ii. The Glengarry will have the **cap brass positioned over the left ear** when worn.²
 - 1. The Glengarry will be centered on the head, and the tip will be **centered between the eyes** of the Cadet. Refer to **Figure 21**.

- c. Playing pipers will wear all black Glengarries.²
- 2. Kilts will be worn only by Cadets who have completed all the requirements to obtain a kilt and who have achieved the rank of Sergeant(C/Sgt) or above OR those who are playing members of the Pipes and Drums.
 - a. Kilts may be worn by all Cadets ranking C/Sgt and up and/or playing musicians, only on Commanding Officer's (COs) parade nights and other regimental parades where such dress is indicated (e.g. St. Julien, Walcheren).
 - b. Kilts will be in *Government Pattern #2* and have knife pleats. Box pleats are usually reserved for senior Cadet Non-Commissioned Officers (NCOs) and officers. The issue of kilts is subject to availability.
- 3. **Sporrans** will be worn by all Cadets in Highland Kit
 - a. **Leather purse sporrans** will be worn by Cadets ranking C/Sgt and above who wear the kilt.
 - i. The sporran will be shined with brown polish to a glass shine.
 - ii. The Calgary Highlanders 10th Battalion pin will be centered on the front of the sporran.
 - b. Horse-hair sporrans will be worn by the SMs with the C1H dress
 - i. Sporrans will be cleaned and combed
 - ii. 2-point sporrans will be worn
- 4. **Sgian Dubhs** may be privately purchased; worn only by C/Sgt and more senior Cadet ranks; and worn with all orders of Highland dress.
 - a. The Sgian Dubh must have a silver or black handle with a cairngorm stone.
 - b. It will be placed on the outside of the right leg
- 5. **Silver Buttons** will be worn on the cadet cutaway.



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- a. Three medium sized buttons will be worn on the front of the tunic
- b. 2 small buttons will be worn on both breast pockets
- c. 2 small buttons will be worn on the shoulder straps
- d. All buttons will be upright and clean
- 6. **Regimental ties** will be worn only by C/Sgt and more senior Cadet ranks. All other ranks will wear the Canadian Armed Forces (CAF) green neckties issued to Cadets.
- 7. **Black webbelts** will be worn with black plastic buckles (Fastex) or CAF brass buckles by all ranks who are in Highland dress.¹
- 8. Cadets who wear Highland dress will privately purchase black, **Oxford style** dress shoes.¹
 - a. Oxfords must be polished to a mirror shine.
 - b. Oxfords will be tightly laced with laces tucked into the shoes so as to conceal them.
 - c. Oxfords shall not be modified with any type of metal cleats, hobnails or other metal attachments to heel or sole. 1
- 9. **Leg Dress** will be worn with C1H and C3H uniforms.
 - a. **Lovat hose** will be worn with C3H uniforms and will be issued from Clothing Stores to Cadets who qualify to wear a kilt.
 - i. Lovat hose will be evenly folded once at the top in such a manner that the:
 - 1. Top of the Lovat hose will show a fold back not exceeding 7 cm (2.75 in).¹
 - b. Spats and Diced Top Hose will be worn with the C1H uniform
 - i. Cadets will be issued a pair of **Red and White Top Hose** from Clothing Stores.
 - 1. Hose will be worn so that the centre seam runs down the back of the leg
 - 2. Top of the Hose will be folded one diamond's length so that a red diamond will be shown
 - 3. The top of the hose will be two finger widths bellow the side of the knee bone.
 - ii. **Spats** will be whitened and properly formed
 - 1. The back of each spat will display an hour glass shape. The front of the spat will be creased along the seam of the spat and ironed.
 - 2. The front of the Spat will just reach the toe cap of the shoe
 - 3. Buttons are to be on the outside of the leg.
 - a. The Velcro will be done up so that it is not visible when being worn. Both the top and bottom buttons on the spat will be fastened.
 - 4. Spats will be whitened with shoe whitener or white shoe polish. Spats will not be bleached to attain whiteness or cleaned.
 - iii. Only Pipers will draw Red and Black Diced Hose.



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


Figure 22 – Proper Creases in the Rear of the Spat

- 10. **Red garter flashes** for hose will be in good repair and will be ironed flat.
 - a. Hose tops should be folded over the white elastic band so as to hide it.
 - i. With the C1H dress, the inside of the flashes will run down the centre of the front diamonds of the hose tops and the end of the flash in line with the bottom of the second row of diamonds.
 - b. Playing Drummers will draw double layered red garter flashes.²
- 11. Highland Kit will be at all times kept free of wrinkles and dirt.
 - a. The CAF green shirt will continue to be worn with Highland kit, with the appropriate creases.
 - b. Kilt pleating should be kept crisp and neat.



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


Figure 23 – Highland C1H Ceremonial Dress



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


Figure 24— Highland C3H Duty Dress



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


Figure 25 – Highland H-3 Duty Dress



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CADET DRESS FOR COMMANDING OFFICER'S (COs) PARADES AND ANNUAL CEREMONIAL REVIEW (ACR)

- 1. White gloves will be worn together with white belts by the Flag Party and Sergeant Majors.
- 2. The Regimental Sergeant Major (RSM), Company Sergeant Major (CSM), Drill Sergeant Major (DSM), Platoon Warrants wear a **white plastic belt** secured with the tri-service brass buckles on top of their tunic. Band will wear a black belt with the tri-service brass buckle.
 - a. Belts and buckles will be maintained in good condition with the brass buckle shined and the belt itself free of tarnish or stains.¹
- 3. The members of the pipes and drums are authorized to wear a plaid with brooch at the discretion of the CO.
- 4. A cadet may receive **medals** from the following two sources:
 - a. The Canadian Honours System (CHS).
 - b. The Canadian Cadet Organization (CCO).
- 5. **Medals** from the CHS shall be suspended above the left breast pocket of the jacket, immediately above and centered. CCO Medals shall be suspended above the right breast pocket of the jacket, immediately above and centered.¹
- 6. When two or more medals are awarded, they will be worn in order of precedence, with the highest priority medal closest to the centre of the chest.¹
 - a. Medals shall hang in one row so that they are fully visible.¹
 - i. If not possible, medals shall be overlapped horizontally, the one with the highest priority showing in full. Normally, five or more medals will require overlapping.¹
 - ii. The maximum width of the mounting is governed by the physique of the individual.¹
 - 1. The bar shall not project beyond the arm seam of the jacket once the mounting is centered with the jacket pocket.¹
- 7. Medals will only be worn with **ceremonial dress**. Ribbons will be worn with all other orders of dress.
- 8. When two or more **ribbons** are worn, they shall be worn in rows, without interval between the ribbons and the rows. Three ribbons shall be worn per row. If a fourth medal is awarded, a second row of ribbons is required. If a seventh medal is awarded, a third row of ribbons is required. Each new row shall be centered on the lower row. Ribbons shall be worn in order of precedence, from right to left of the wearer for medals from Canadian Honours System (CHS) and from left to right of the wearer for Canadian Cadet Organization (CCO) Medals, with the highest priority ribbon closest to the centre of the chest on the top row if more than one row is required. Where a single ribbon constitutes a row; it shall be centered above a lower row. Refer to **Figure 26**.

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REGIMENTAL PARADE POSITION KIT

- 1. Sergeants and seniors holding parade positions will carry **drill canes** consistent with the infantry style.
 - a. At all times, the drill canes will have the head and tip polished and be in good condition.
 - b. The Corps Drill Sergeant Major (**DSM**), Company Sergeant Major (**CSM**), and Regimental Sergeant Major (**RSM**) will carry a **pace stick**.¹
- 2. The wear of **regimental sashes** is only authorized for Sergeants and above.¹
 - a. The sashes will be maintained in good condition, free of stains and other grime.
 - i. There will be no knots in the tassels.
 - b. With the exception of the C/CWO, the shoulder sash is worn from the **right shoulder** falling off to the left hip.
 - The sash will be secured under the lapel of the jacket and the epaulettes if necessary for the Canadian Armed Forces (CAF) Cadet Jacket/Tunic, foldaway.
 - c. The C/CWO will not wear a sash in routine training dress
 - 1. Only in C1H will the C/CWO wear a sash in which case an **officer sash** will be worn on the **left shoulder** falling of the right hip.
 - ii. If the sash partially or entirely obscures medals in their normal configuration, the medals are to be pinned on the sash at the height and location that coincides with the normal placement of the medals on the jacket.¹
 - d. C/Sgts will draw a bright red sash.²
 - e. C/WOs and C/MWOs will draw a darker, crimson coloured sash.²
- 3. A **Balmoral** may be worn by C/WOs, C/MWOs, C/CWOs and CIC officer with their FTU.
- 4. A **Badger Sporran** may be worn by the RSM only if they have attained the rank of C/CWO.

DRESS FOR THE PIPES AND DRUMS BAND

Orders of Dress for the 2137 Calgary Highlanders Cadet Corps Pipes and Drums Band differ from the regular Corps dress; is specified by the Band Officer and staff; and is subject to availability.
